EUE-Net General Assembly

MINUTES

Location: *Hilton Cyprus Hotel, Nicosia, Cyprus*

Date and time: *FRIDAY, 1 MAY 2009, 12:10HRS – 13:30HRS*

D. Talaba: Information upon the present stage of the project – 3 directions:

1. Quality of student practical placements: the project QPlanet has already taken over this mission;
2. Career Development Office – Network: a new project has been submitted to EC, the evaluation result is expected in the following period; next year a conference will be organized for all CDOs in Europe.
3. Entrepreneurship: first steps were already taken by organizing a session in the present conference (Session 1. Entrepreneurship as a transversal subject in the University curricula / 9 presentations).
 - Questionnaires for tuning entrepreneurship: under development; in the following months the partners will receive the request for filling in the questionnaires;
 - Mobilities will be organized for students to SMEs.

This action line will be kept at a minimum level, since there are already a lot of initiatives at the European level in this direction.

S. Lache: for enlarging the EUE-Net, the organizations interested to be part of EUE-Net have to submit their intention to slache@unitbv.ro. Simona will send by e-mail to those who are interested the documents necessary to fill in.

D. Talaba: Staff costs – not critical for the intermediate report

S. Lache: clarifications for closing the financial contract with some of the partners – the issue was discussed individually with each partner involved.

D. Talaba: Next meeting of a core group of EUE-Net: in Autumn; there has to be decided the location – one suggestion: San Sebastian, Spain.

The next General Assembly (in 2010) – initially planed in Istambul. To be decided:

- the location;
- if the EUE-Net conference will be co-located with another event organized by ERACON or CGU (Compostela Group of Universities)?

L. Uden: the co-location of the EUE-Net annual meeting has advantages but also disadvantages (lack of communication between partners, since they find themselves in a big conference, with hundreds of participants).

I. Sunley: it was a benefit for EUE-Net regarding increasing its visibility – to organize the conference in cooperation with ERACON.

A. Jungman: the EUE-Net partners were spread, without having the chance to discuss too much subjects of interest for the network.

D. Talaba: for next year the number of presentations will be reduced, so that the people have the chance for debates around the launched topics.

Lorna Uden is chief editor at two journals. There will be selected 7 papers from the ones presented in the last two EUE-Net meetings and submitted for publishing in the journals.

D. Rutkauskiene: what about the papers proceedings?

D. Talaba: they are available at the registration desk, since EUE-Net has already issued the proceedings before the conference, as usual.

L. Uden: how the reimbursement will be done?

S. Lache: a message will be sent in euenet list explaining all the details related to the reimbursement procedure.

Finally, Prof. Doru Talaba thanks to all the partners for their contribution to the project and hopes for the same good co-operation in the future.
